
Last Chance to Get Your Flu Shot at TWN

Living safely with wildlife

North Vancouver is home to a variety of wild animals, including skunks, raccoons, coyotes, cougars, and bears.

Whether they're searching for food, or looking for a warm place to call home, there are steps you can take to make your property less inviting to them.



Guidelines for setting out your containers

- Place your carts and containers at the curb between 5:30am and 7:30am on your collection day
- Set them side by side in a straight line, making sure your recycling is set apart from the carts
- Place your yellow bag <u>beside</u>, not inside, the blue box or grey box
- Unlock the metal clips from your carts and attach them to the lid handles before collection


